Final Document of the Assembly

The second aim of this letter is to introduce and offer you **the final document of the Assembly**. We attach it to this *Projects*.

Allow me to start by thanking the writing team who not only worked right through the Assembly but carried on their work with dedication, love, and commitment to us all during the weeks that followed. On behalf of the whole community, I want to say THANK YOU to James O’Brien (Australia), Marielle Matthee (Netherlands), Lucina Koyio (Kenya)



and Gabriel Fernández (Uruguay). The role of the writing team in an Assembly is critical for us all. They were entrusted with the responsibility of capturing the spirit of the Assembly and the journey travelled by the delegates so that we can all, in our own local contexts, live and feel the beating heart of our community.

It is not my intention to try and summarise the document. That is an impossible task for me. All I will say is that it is a true reflection of the joy, discernment, and hope that the delegates at the Assembly in Amiens felt and lived. However, I do have three invitations for you. I really hope that you will receive these invitations with the energy and enthusiasm with which I send them.

It is now your work to take this document and read it a few times, pray over it, let the Spirit touch you through it and share and deepen the experience in your local groups, your national community and within your regional teams. **I invite you to make the document your own.** Please, do not leave it in your email and file it simply as a well written document.

While the document is a faithful description of the journey travelled during the 10 days of the Assembly, it is also a document that captures a lot of dreams and recommendations. It is very rich in this respect. **It launches us into the future with courage and hope.** We have a lot of rich material to work on and journey together.

It has been said and restated that we are one (global) lay Ignatian apostolic community in the Church. This is a foundational statement that **I invite you also to reflect upon and let it sink into your very being.** This “feeling” and “being” one community has far reaching implications that the new leadership team that you sent on mission will certainly discern and go forth with. To be explicit and avoid confusion, this being and feeling one community means that CLC is making a statement that we are no longer a federation of communities, but we are at our core...ONE! One community! We are one family and as one family dispersed around the world “I” become concerned about the life of the other family members wherever they are in our common home. If one of us hurts, we all feel the hurt. Likewise, if one of us rejoices, we all rejoice. Let us work together to continue building our community. Here again, please reflect, pray, and share on this being and feeling one community. Bring your prayers, insights and questions to your groups, national communities, and regional teams.

An important part of being one community, one family, is communication. Just as in every family all the members need to speak to each other and understand each other’s point of view, we too need to hear from all of you. **Please do not leave us alone.** For this team to be of real service we need you, we need you to remain in communication with us. **I therefore invite you to reach out to us with any means that makes sense for you.** You have our contact details, please use them! On our side, I can promise you our commitment to do the same and reach out to you. We will, as recommended in the Assembly, also look for new modern collaborative means to improve our communication.
